Infant Baptism may take place during any weekend Mass or at 1:15 p.m. on any Sunday. Baptism classes are held monthly.

Adult Entrance into the Catholic Church takes place through the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.)**.

For adolescents, preparation for **Confirmation** takes place within the Religious Education Program. For adults, preparation takes place through a brief special program.

Matrimony Diocesan directives require at least 6 months notice. An interview with the pastor is required before a date can be placed on the parish schedule. A marriage preparation course is provided periodically by the parish.

Reconciliation (Confession) is scheduled on Saturdays from 3:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. or by appointment with one of the priests.

Anointing of the Sick is available to anyone seriously ill or anticipating surgery.

Interpreted Mass for the Deaf every Sunday at the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

Please contact the parish office to receive information about any of the above sacraments.

THE WORD OF GOD THIS SUNDAY: For this Third Sunday of Easter, the Scriptural readings begin with a passage from the Acts of the Apostles where the disciples make plain that they must "...obey God rather than men." In the second reading, from the Book of Revelation, we are given a vision of "the one who sits on the throne and the lamb." Finally, in the Gospel account, we see the disciples fail at fishing until they are with Jesus. The Scriptural readings for this Sunday remind us of the power of the presence of God in our lives.

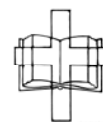

Confirmation was celebrated with Bishop Zubik this Saturday. Please keep our newly confirmed in your prayers so that they may always be opened to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We are blessed as a parish community to have so many faithfilled youth!

Little children and God: three-to-six year olds have a marvelous capacity to absorb what is going on around them. In recent years, a new faith enrichment called **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd** was developed based on the Montessori Method focusing on the Bible and the Mass. Our parish has initiated three groups of children in this CGS method this year. ↗

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS (cont'd)

All year children ages 3-5 have been working with specially prepared materials in an environment called the “atrium” with their catechists and aides. We now invite family members and parishioners to an “**Open House**” in our portable “atrium” – in the Library – after the 9:00 a.m. mass (**9:45 – 10:30 a.m.**) and after 12:15 p.m. Mass (**1:00 – 2:00 p.m.**) on **Sunday, April 18**, to view the beautiful hand-made materials and the special environment. Parents and grandparents of children ages 3 and 4 are invited to come and see - and to learn how little children can be exposed to the rich traditions of our faith thru the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd method.



SUMMER FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS: We will have two options in July for grades 5-8: Five Thursdays in July (July 1, 8, 15, 22 and 29) or the entire week of July 19-23. Please note that if you register for one of these two summer options, the **youth must attend** all five sessions. 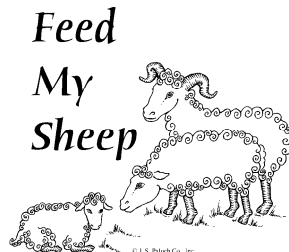
MUSIC CORNER By David Dreher

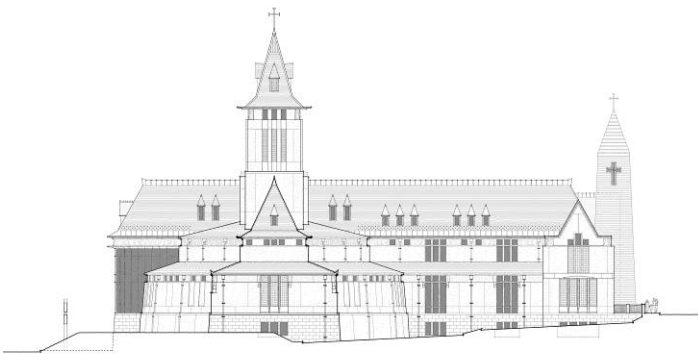
