Infant Baptism may take place during any weekend Mass or at 1:15 p.m. on any Sunday. Baptism classes are held monthly.

Adult Entrance into the Catholic Church takes place through the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.)**.

For adolescents, preparation for **Confirmation** takes place within the Religious Education Program. For adults, preparation takes place through a brief special program.

Matrimony Diocesan directives require at least 6 months notice. An interview with the pastor is required before a date can be placed on the parish schedule. A marriage preparation course is provided periodically by the parish.

Reconciliation (Confession) is scheduled on Saturdays from 3:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. or by appointment with one of the priests.

Anointing of the Sick is available to anyone seriously ill or anticipating surgery.

Interpreted Mass for the Deaf every Sunday at the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

THE WORD OF GOD THIS SUNDAY: For this Fourth Sunday of Easter, the Scriptural readings begin with a passage from the Acts of the Apostles where we see the early disciples encounter opposition. In the second reading, from the Book of Revelation, we see how the call of Christ is made to people of every race and nation. Finally, in the Gospel account, once again we see Jesus as the Good Shepherd. The Scriptural readings for this Sunday remind us that despite persecution and challenge, we are not alone.

As we are completing our Religious Education classes for this year, we offer our thanks to Celine Mitchell, Anthony Bradley, Krissy Brown and Mary Jo Iachini and an incredibly dedicated team of volunteer catechists. Our Faith Formation programs serve over one thousand young people. As we assist parents in their efforts to hand on Catholic faith, we continue to depend on so many dedicated individuals. Thank you.

PARISH PROPERTY IN MARS Now that most parish activity takes place on the property at the corner of Route 228 and Franklin Road, the parish property in Mars must be addressed. Therefore, after consultation with the parish Pastoral and Finance Councils, and with the approval of Bishop Zubik, we are about to close on the sale of the lower portion of the property on Hook Street (for approximately \$350,000.00). We are also prepared to market for sale the former rectory (and a small portion of the parking lot) on Clarke Street. This will enable us to retain the church and the hall until a new church is built. The value of continued use of the church is clear (especially for funerals and weddings). In a spirit of Christian solidarity, after consultation with the parish Pastoral and Finance Councils and with the permission of Bishop Zubik, Saint Kilian Parish will soon permit the weekly use (Sunday mornings) of the parish church in Mars by the New Life Anglican Church. New Life Anglican Church is a new faith community that is led by the Rev Paul Cooper, formerly of St Christopher's Church in Cranberry Township. The group is affiliated with the Anglican Diocese of Pittsburgh, a part of the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA), which is led by local Anglican Archbishop Robert Duncan. They will also be utilizing the room below the sacristy (the former music ministry space) and paying the parish a monthly rent. In this way we are making prudent use of our existing resources as we address our parish debt and look forward to the construction of a new church.

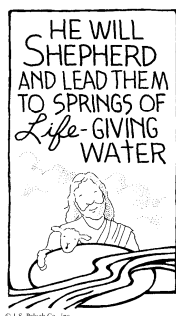

MUSIC CORNER By David Dreher

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is always celebrated as Good Shepherd Sunday in all three cycles of the Gospel readings. That is why there is such strong imagery in the responsorial psalm (*We Are God's People*) as well as the song for the Presentation of the Gifts (*Because The Lord Is My Shepherd*) and the first communion song (*Shepherd of Our Hearts*). But we must always remember that we celebrate the season of Easter until the feast of Pentecost. That is why our Gathering Hymn and Sending Forth hymn reflect Paschal themes. That is also the case for *This Is A Day of New Beginnings* written by Lori True. The verses sung by the cantor call us to remember the past but to move toward the future with hope and faith born again through Jesus Christ. As mentioned at last week's Confirmation services, we may come to church carrying life's struggles and disappointments but through the Eucharist and the power of the Holy Spirit we are set ablaze... "to seek new paths!"

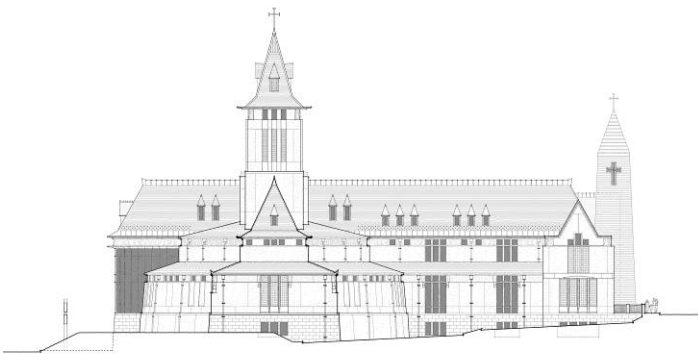
