Matrimony Diocesan directives require at least 6 months notice. An interview with the pastor is required before a date can be placed on the parish schedule. A marriage preparation course is provided periodically by the parish.

Reconciliation (Confession) is scheduled on Saturdays from 3:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. or by appointment with one of the priests.

Anointing of the Sick is available to anyone seriously ill or anticipating surgery.

Interpreted Mass for the Deaf every Sunday at the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

Please contact the parish office to receive information about any of the above sacraments.

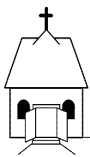

MUSIC CORNER By David Dreher

Psalm 104 is a poetic masterpiece praising God for the marvels of creation. The Psalm unfolds in a seven-part structure modeled after the creation account of Genesis chapter 1. Its connection with the liturgical celebration of Pentecost is easy to see. For the Hebrews the cause of creation was God's breath or spirit (*ruach*). Take this breath away and creatures die; give them divine breath and they live. The Hawaiians have a tradition of greeting each other by touching foreheads and noses and breathing in each others *ha*, or spirit. They call this the breath of life. (*Aloha*) What a wonderful image to share on this special day of Pentecost; we share the Spirit of God, the *ha*, the *ruach*!

I would like to thank all the members of the Music Ministry for their devotion and time, but especially to the members of our various choirs. This weekend is the last we will hear of the Bell Choir and Adult Choir and last month, the Children's Choir, Ringem Kidz Black and Gold groups and the Youth Bell Choir. 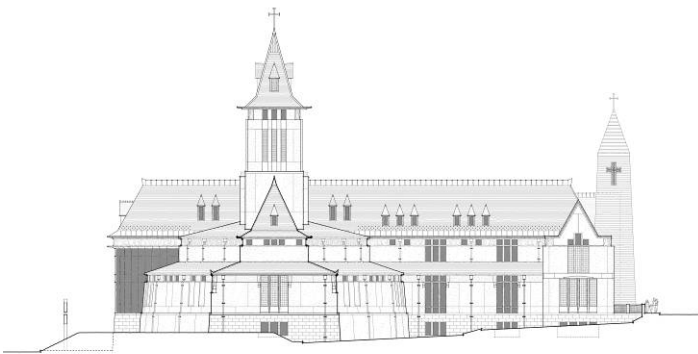
