**Infant Baptism** may take place during any weekend Mass or at 1:15 p.m. on any Sunday. Baptism classes are held monthly.

Adult Entrance into the Catholic Church takes place through the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.)**.

For adolescents, preparation for **Confirmation** takes place within the Religious Education Program. For adults, preparation takes place through a brief special program.

**Matrimony** Diocesan directives require at least 6 months notice. An interview with the pastor is required before a date can be placed on the parish schedule. A marriage preparation course is provided periodically by the parish.

**Reconciliation** (Confession) is scheduled on Saturdays from 3:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. or by appointment with one of the priests.

**Anointing of the Sick** is available to anyone seriously ill or anticipating surgery.

**Interpreted Mass for the Deaf** every Sunday at the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

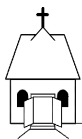

**CHAIR VOLUNTEERS NEEDED** As you sit at Mass on Sunday, you must have asked at some time: "So, what happens to all these chairs when this is set up as a gym?" Well, the answer is that a group of volunteers tear down the church set up each Monday after the 9:00 a.m. Mass and set it back up on Friday mornings around 9:00 a.m. As the weather turns beautiful, our trusty volunteers take much deserved breaks. We are in need of help to fill out the crew. The more help, the quicker the work. It usually takes less than an hour. Why pay for a gym membership when you can get exercise twice a week at your parish? Please join us.

**SECOND CENTURY CAMPAIGN—DEBT REDUCTION:**

All households of the parish received information on our debt reduction phase of the Second Century Campaign. Please consider how you can help. Our success depends on all parishioners participating to the best of their ability.

**CLEARANCES - ALL MINISTERS AND VOLUNTEERS:**

Bishop Zubik and the policies of the Diocese of Pittsburgh demand that all those in any parish ministry, on any consultative body, or volunteer where children and young people are involved must have appropriate clearances. Why? All child protection policies are in place to protect children. Child abuse is not only a crime but also a horrific betrayal of trust. Children clearly trust those they see frequently through their parishes. We owe it to our children to take the time to insure that our parish is truly a safe environment for children and young people. The Diocese and the parish maintain strict confidentiality about these records, however, because there is a common database (not of content but of completions) the Diocese is aware of who is compliant and who is not. Periodic audits are made of parish child protection records. It is expected that all clearances are on file and up to date. Our parish has not been audited as yet but it can not be far away. If those in ministries, consultative bodies or volunteers are not compliant with child protection clearances, we are to contact them requesting them to do so immediately. After a reasonable time, if they remain non-compliant, we are to write to the individuals and indicate that until they are compliant, they may not exercise their ministries, offices or volunteer. The pastor nor the parish staff want it to go that far for anyone, but we need your help. Appropriate forms to complete the process may be obtained at the Parish Center on Monday, Tuesdays or Wednesdays from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Questions may be directed to: loislessner1@msn.com. One important part of the clearance process is attending a presentation entitled: Protection God's Children. Thousands of people throughout the Diocese have done so. Those adults who are volunteering for Vacation Bible Camp, or intending to teach the CCD summer class or the fall sessions, or any school parent that is considering volunteering for next year, has to attend one of these classes as part of their requirements to become compliant. We are offering a class here at Saint Kilian on Wednesday June 9th at 7:00 p.m. in the cafeteria. 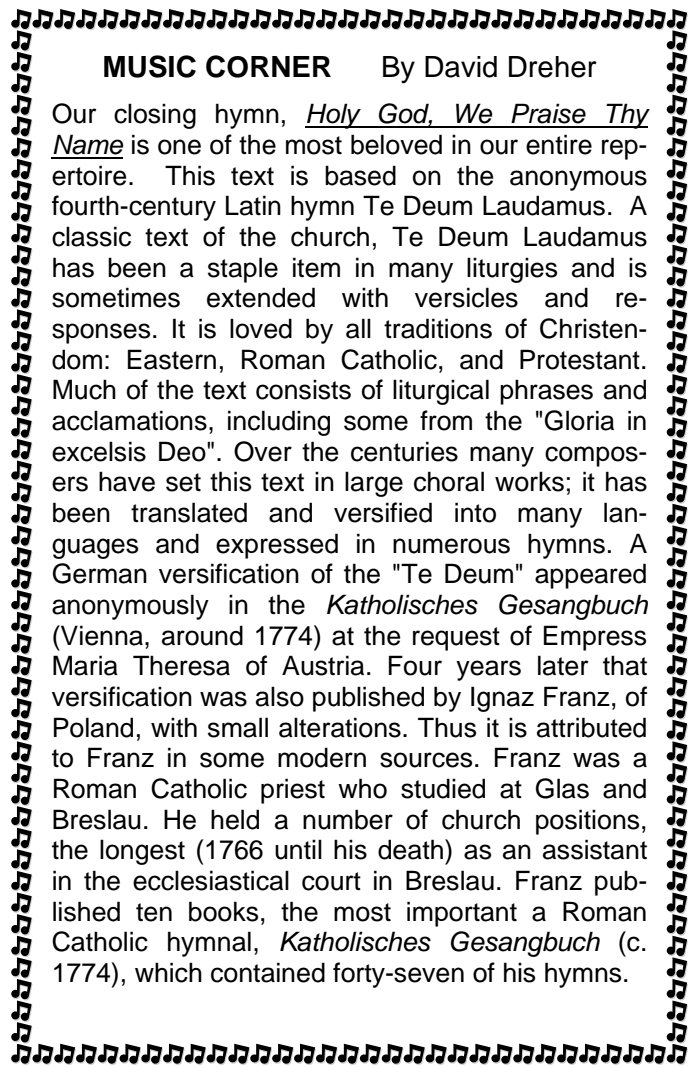

**MUSIC CORNER** By David Dreher

Our closing hymn, *Holy God, We Praise Thy Name* is one of the most beloved in our entire repertoire. This text is based on the anonymous fourth-century Latin hymn *Te Deum Laudamus*. A classic text of the church, *Te Deum Laudamus* has been a staple item in many liturgies and is sometimes extended with versicles and responses. It is loved by all traditions of Christendom: Eastern, Roman Catholic, and Protestant. Much of the text consists of liturgical phrases and acclamations, including some from the "Gloria in excelsis Deo". Over the centuries many composers have set this text in large choral works; it has been translated and versified into many languages and expressed in numerous hymns. A German versification of the "Te Deum" appeared anonymously in the *Katholisches Gesangbuch* (Vienna, around 1774) at the request of Empress Maria Theresa of Austria. Four years later that versification was also published by Ignaz Franz, of Poland, with small alterations. Thus it is attributed to Franz in some modern sources. Franz was a Roman Catholic priest who studied at Glas and Breslau. He held a number of church positions, the longest (1766 until his death) as an assistant in the ecclesiastical court in Breslau. Franz published ten books, the most important a Roman Catholic hymnal, *Katholisches Gesangbuch* (c. 1774), which contained forty-seven of his hymns.

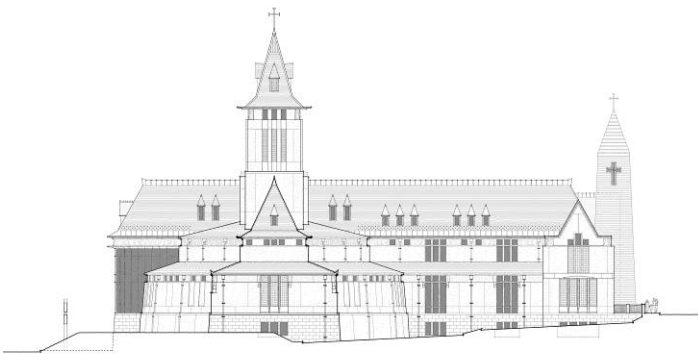

What an amazing spring! Our teams are moving on to the final stages of this year's sport offering. Our 3 soccer teams have performed very well in the Diocese of Pittsburgh soccer league. The 3<sup>rd</sup> graders came out strong and worked and honed their skills, worked as a team and played with enthusiasm! The 4<sup>th</sup> graders have grown into their niche in the soccer program and refined their skills further, learned more about sportsmanship, developed more confidence and really showed their skills and dedication to the sport and to our school. Both the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade will finish off their season at Youthtown Fields on June 5<sup>th</sup>! Finally but not last, our Junior Varsity team moved into Section 4 of the Diocese program and worked very hard these past few months to continue to improve and work as a team. The Saint Kilian team of all 5<sup>th</sup> graders played some stiff competition made up of 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders in other schools in the section! A great accomplishment for our team as they secured a 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish. This squad will also play in the Diocesan League season championships at Youthtown Fields over the course of June 3<sup>rd</sup> through the 6<sup>th</sup>.

Registrations are being accepted for fall 2010/2011 cross country and soccer. Our tryout dates for the Junior Varsity soccer program (5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders in 2010/2011) will most likely be in August 2010, and teams will be determined shortly after the tryouts. Dates will be shared with those who register and provide their email addresses; via bulletin; and also via a general email push to the enrolled students in July.
