Infant Baptism may take place during any weekend Mass or at 1:15 p.m. on any Sunday. Baptism classes are held monthly.

Adult Entrance into the Catholic Church takes place through the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.)**.

For adolescents, preparation for **Confirmation** takes place within the Religious Education Program. For adults, preparation takes place through a brief special program.

Matrimony Diocesan directives require at least 6 months notice. An interview with the pastor is required before a date can be placed on the parish schedule. A marriage preparation course is provided periodically by the parish.

Reconciliation (Confession) is scheduled on Saturdays from 3:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. or by appointment with one of the priests.

Anointing of the Sick is available to anyone seriously ill or anticipating surgery.

Interpreted Mass for the Deaf every Sunday at the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

THE WORD OF GOD THIS SUNDAY: For this feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord (Corpus Christi), the Scriptural readings begin with a passage from the Book of Genesis where a non-Jewish king blesses the patriarch Abraham. In the second reading, from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, we hear the core New Testament tradition about the Eucharist. In the Gospel account, Jesus feeds hungry people prefiguring the great gift of the Eucharist. The Scriptural readings for this Sunday ask us to reflect on the great sacramental gift of the Body and Blood of the Lord.

CHAIR VOLUNTEERS NEEDED As you sit at Mass on Sunday, you must have asked at some time: "So, what happens to all these chairs when this is set up as a gym?" Well, the answer is that a group of volunteers tear down the church set up each Monday after the 9:00 a.m. Mass and set it back up on Friday mornings around 9:00 a.m. As the weather turns beautiful, our trusty volunteers take much deserved breaks. We are in need of help to fill out the crew. The more help, the quicker the work. It usually takes less than an hour. Why pay for a gym membership when you can get exercise twice a week at your parish? Please join us.

CLEARANCES - ALL MINISTERS AND VOLUNTEERS:

Bishop Zubik and the policies of the Diocese of Pittsburgh demand that all those in any parish ministry, on any consultative body, or volunteer where children and young people are involved must have appropriate clearances. Why? All child protection policies are in place to protect children. Child abuse is not only a crime but also a horrific betrayal of trust. Children clearly trust those they see frequently through their parishes. We owe it to our children to take the time to insure that our parish is truly a safe environment for children and young people. The Diocese and the parish maintain strict confidentiality about these records, however, because there is a common database (not of content but of completions) the Diocese is aware of who is compliant and who is not. Periodic audits are made of parish child protection records. It is expected that all clearances are on file and up to date. Our parish has not been audited as yet but it can not be far away. If those in ministries, consultative bodies or volunteers are not compliant with child protection clearances, we are to contact them requesting them to do so immediately. After a reasonable time, if they remain non-compliant, we are to write to the individuals and indicate that until they are compliant, they may not exercise their ministries, offices or volunteer. The pastor nor the parish staff want it to go that far for anyone, but we need your help. Appropriate forms to complete the process may be obtained at the Parish Center on Monday, Tuesdays or Wednesdays from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Questions may be directed to: loislessner1@msn.com. One important part of the clearance process is attending a presentation entitled: Protecting God's Children. Thousands of people throughout the Diocese have done so. Those adults who are volunteering for Vacation Bible Camp, or intending to teach the CCD summer class or the fall sessions, or any school parent that is considering volunteering for next year, has to attend one of these classes as part of their requirements to become compliant. We are offering a class here at Saint Kilian on Wednesday June 9th at 7:00 p.m. in the cafeteria. 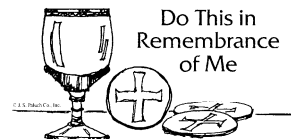
MUSIC CORNER By David Dreher

Liturgically speaking we are now in Ordinary Time. That is why we have changed our musical refrains and sung parts of the Mass to the familiar Celtic Alleluia and the Mass of Creation. The Mass of Creation is now 25 years old! Marty Haugen writes, “It was written for a very specific community with its own gifts and its own quirks regarding liturgy. It has surprised and delighted me by taking on a larger life for so many other communities. While there are those who may not like or use the setting for various reasons, it has become a staple in parishes in the United States and other parts of the world, in no small part due to the fact that I crosses lines of musical style. It is my hope that the revision will serve communities even better than the currently published version.” The revisions he refers to will be the versions of all the mass parts that we now use that must conform to the new texts approved by the Vatican for use in the Liturgy. The proposed date of implementation will most likely be the 1st week of Advent 2011. The various music publishers are now rewriting and rerecording our familiar mass settings to reflect those changes. There are many composers already working on new musical versions of the mass settings and we may be privileged to be a test parish for some of this music. There will be more news regarding this in the future. Stay tuned.

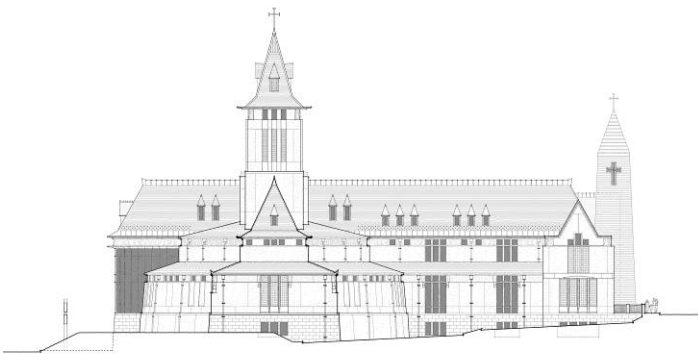
